1. A Law to Amend the Imports (Regulation)  
Laws of 1962 and 1967

Section 3 of the principal Law is hereby amended with the substitution of its sub-section (1) with the following new sub-section.

"Whenever it becomes necessary, in the public interest, to restrict and regulate the importation of goods for the encouragement of local production and manufacture, the improvement of the balance of trade, compliance with international obligations, the development of the economy of the Republic or the prohibition of imports from countries which act in such manner so as to violate the international law against the economic unity & interests of the Republic, the Minister may, by Order published in the Official Gazette of the Republic, restrict and regulate the importation of the goods specified in the Order".

Section 2 of the principal Law is hereby amended with the substitution of the terms "import" and "importation" with the following new term:

"Import" with its grammatical variations means the presentation of an entry with the documents prescribed by any Customs Laws in force for the time being, the payment of any Customs and Excise duties due thereon, and their removal from Customs control.
